

## Today I am going to the Gainesville Circus Center!


I will wait in my car with my family or friends until it is time to go inside.






We don't want to arrive too early. Waiting in the car helps us feel calm and ready for the fun show ahead!

## When it is time to go in, we will walk through the front doors.






In the lobby, I will see a bathroom on the right, and a place to leave my shoes.


We will all take our shoes off and leave them by the door. Our shoes will be safe here.









## There will be lots of comfortable places to sit! I can sit in hula hoops, on mats, on yoga balls, or on couches.






There will be neon tape on the floor that marks where the performers will be.

I need to stay behind the neon tape so the performers can stay safe while they do their amazing tricks.





Behind the performers, there will be a big black wall. I might see tall, bright lights.

These lights are for the show, and it's important not to touch them.





Some of the performers might be on trapeze, silks, slings, or rings lyra. Others might juggle, dance, or do acrobatics.

The performers have practiced a lot, so even though it might look like they're falling, they are safe.









On the right side of the performance area, there will be speakers. This side might be a little bit louder. If I think the music will be too loud, I can bring headphones to help make it quieter, or sit on the side further away from the speakers.

It's ok if I make noise or move around at circus during the show.

I can walk around, as long as I stay behind the line.

I can make noises and cheer during the show.

I can rock or flap.

I can use my "happy hands" (which means waving my hands in the air) to show the performers I like what they're doing.




The performers love it when I use my happy hands and have an excited face.

We can clap and cheer at the end of each act to let them know we enjoyed the show!


Clapping and cheering can be loud.




If I need to go to the bathroom during the show, I can quietly leave and walk down one of the two aisles marked by the neon tape.



The bathroom is located in the lobby. I will remember to use just a little bit of toilet paper because the pipes are old and need to be treated gently.










After I'm done, I can wash my hands and return to the show.








If I get hungry or thirsty,

Sometimes, I might feel excited, nervous, or even a little scared. That's okay.






