Teenage Parent Program (TAP)

TAP is a voluntary educational program that is designed to fit the immediate needs of students who are pregnant and/or parenting.

TAP helps a student continue or complete middle or high school requirements while learning the many skills needed to become a competent parent and responsible adult.

HOW TO ENROLL

- ✓ You must be under 19 years of age with grade appropriate academic credits
- ✓ Complete an application to the TAP Program
- ✓ Contact your zoned school Guidance Counselor
- ✓ Contact TAP Social Worker
- ✓ After acceptance, schedule course registration (parenting course) with the Guidance Counselor or Assistant Principal
- Children must have documentation of physical examination, immunizationrecord, and birth certificate

Teen Pregnancy Facts

- Three in ten teenage girls in the U.S. become pregnant at least once by the age of 20 (CDC, 2017).
- > Seven out of ten teenagers have hadsex by the time they reach age 19 (Guttmacher Institute, 2017).
- > Teenage mothers are less likely tocomplete high school; only one-thirdreceive a high school diploma (CDC,2017).

- Transportation for infants to daycare center where child has been accepted, and transportation for teenage moms/dads to their zoned schools

The School Board of Alachua County partners with the Early Learning coalition of Alachua County (ELC). ELC provides financial assistance for childcare and school readiness for teenage parents that meet eligibility requirements. They coordinate services for children from birth through kindergarten.

The School Board of Alachua County has a Daycare Services Agreement for Children of Teenage Parents. This agreement is a partnership with Child Care providers in Alachua County to provide daycare services for children of teen parents. Services provided by the child Care Centers shall comply with the pertinent provisions of Florida Statutes and Rules of Florida Department of Education in accordance with Section 1003.54, *Florida Statutes*.
